2018 AMIC Qld Apprentice of the Year Competition

ENTRY RULES & CONDITIONS

- The AMIC Apprentice Competition ('The competition') is an Australian Meat Industry Council ('AMIC') project and it is made available to all apprentices in all Independent Local Butcher shops throughout Australia who are currently under a Certificate III in Meat Processing (Retail Butcher) apprenticeship.
- The Competition is open to all Level 3 and 4 (who have completed levels 1 and 2) apprentices employed by an Independent Local Butcher by the closing date of this application.
- Each apprentice must still be within their apprenticeship contract term at the time of the State Competition in the year immediately prior to the National Competition.
- Only one nomination per eligible apprentice.
- AMIC reserves the right to accept and/or decline an apprentice entering the competition at either a State or National level for whatever valid reason.
- Each apprentice entering the competition agrees to abide by the rules, conditions and reasonable directions given by AMIC, its Councillors, its Employees and/or its Officers.
- AMIC does not take any responsibility for an apprentice who acts outside of the rules, conditions and reasonable directions given by AMIC, its Councillors, its Employees and/or its Officers.
- Each apprentice entering the competition will do so with the full knowledge and support of their Employer and, where appropriate, with the full knowledge and support of their Parent or Guardian.
- Each apprentice agrees to be part of the competition publicity and public relations activities prior to and following the State and National competitions.
- Each apprentice will act in a manner that is appropriate and suitable to the role of an industry ambassador during the competitions and for all publicity purposes.
- AMIC, its Councillors, its Employees and/or its Officers will provide suitable and appropriate supervision and guardianship to each apprentice during the events prior to and following the National Competition.
- AMIC, its Councillors, its Employees and/or its Officers, as far as is reasonably practicable, will provide for the health, safety and wellbeing of each apprentice at the State and National Competitions.
- AMIC will cover the costs of travel, travel insurance, accommodation and some meals to each State apprentice who attends the National Competition. Each apprentice at the National Competition will be responsible for their own personal costs.
- Personal Safety – it is a condition of entry that each apprentice will wear a mesh glove and other PPE during the competition.
- Dress Code - apprentices must be suitable dressed during the competition program and at the various AMIC functions. This includes your own Company clothing (shirts & caps) during the competition. Black trousers/skirt, white shirt or Company shirt at the various functions and events.
- The criteria (which will be advised to entrants prior to judging) will include:
 - ⇒ **PART A:** A Theory Exam lasting approx. 1-1.5hrs
 - ⇒ **PART B:** A Practical Exam lasting approx. 2hrs
All finalists will be asked to complete several tasks as they would in their normal working environment.
 - ⇒ **PART C:** Mystery Box lasting approx. 2hrs
- The judges' decision will be final.
- Finalists will be notified in writing and must agree to be present on **9th May 2018 at Peter Boodles Quality Meats; 188 Berserker Street, Berserker & Beef Australia 2018; 134 William Street, Rockhampton** to participate in the judging to determine the apprentice of the year.
- The winner of the 2018 Qld Apprentice of the Year Competition will represent Qld at the National Competition in **Perth, WA; 8-9th February 2019.**
- Employers must agree to release their nominated Apprentice on the **8-9th February 2019** to participate in this event
- The Employer must agree to pay his Apprentice an ordinary day's wage for the day of the judging.
